



# Accessing Government Procurement Opportunities in Canada

## OVERVIEW

The Canadian public sector has many procurement opportunities available to U.S. organizations. Most Canadian government departments and agencies post procurement tenders online so they can be easily accessible. These contract notices are often reposted and circulated to a wider set of potential bidders on more general procurement portals. To help U.S. businesses access these opportunities, below is a list of official government procurement websites:

## FEDERAL
